

Students course placement is determined by your content area teacher not your counselor.

Teachers make their determination based on:

- Mid-Year Grade (marking period 1 and 2)
- District Assessment
- IXL Diagnostic Assessment
- CogAT

Teachers also consider your:

- Ability to handle to content area material
- Work ethic
- Completion of classwork/homework assignments
- Ability to meet deadlines for submission of assignments

Level Change Requests

Students should speak with their teacher PRIOR to requesting a Level Change.

Students request a <u>Level Change</u> by submitting a letter from a parent/guardian requesting a level change; letters must be brought to school counselors by **April 19**;

Director reviews the student's request as well as academic history and teacher placement. Directors make decisions by **April 24**;

If student's request for a level change is not granted, student may complete an <u>Appeal</u> <u>Level Change Request</u>.

- Completed form must be brought to school counselor by **April 29**;
- Students will be allowed to waive into the course without the approval of the teacher or Director;
- However, since the student did not meet the criteria for the course level and because they were advised that their requested placement was not appropriate, the student <u>must</u> remain in the course regardless of academic performance.


