Create a quiz with 5-10 questions for someone who has read the book to answer. Include the answers to your quiz!	Write a letter to the author telling them about your favorite part. Explain in detail why it was your favorite part. Include at least one question you would like to ask the author.	Write a summary of the book including the most important events from the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
STORY MAP	RATE THE STORY	COMIC STRIP
Make a story map/chart of the characters, setting, problem, and solution.	On a scale from 1-5 (5 being the highest), rate the story you read. Explain why you chose this rating in at least 5 sentences.	Create a cartoon narrative that retells the story in your own words. Be sure to include the main characters, setting, and important events from the beginning, middle & end.
