Week of Respect – Oct. 1st - 5th



The New Jersey Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying Law designates the week beginning the first Monday in October of each year as a “Week of Respect” in New Jersey.

Here at the Student Center, we use the Week of Respect to highlight positive behaviors that are encouraged every day at Bayonne High School. Our goal is to place an emphasis on recognizing diversity and respecting one another.

We will be making daily morning announcements to promote awareness, and also plan to provide some opportunities throughout the week for students to get involved. More information will be provided soon.

School Violence Awareness Week Oct. 15th – 19th

One of our roles at the Student Center is Conflict Resolution. We provide conflict mediation services, which focuses on encouraging and coaching students who are in conflict to talk out their issues using healthy, effective communication.

If you become aware of any signs of potential conflict or violence regarding your teen, have a conversation with him/her about it, and do not hesitate to reach out to us, your child’s Dean, Vice Principal or Guidance Counselor.
