What is The Early College Academy?

The Early College Academy is intended to give academically prepared students the opportunity to earn an Associate of Arts degree from Hudson County Community College while also achieving their high school diploma.

The Early College Academy is structured as a four year cohort allowing enrolled students to satisfy high school graduation requirements and HCCC's college-level courses in fulfillment of the Associate degree requirements.

Projected Course Sequence

Freshman Year

- All courses at BHS
- 8 courses (includes 0 Period)

Sophomore Year

- All Courses at BHS
- 7 courses

Junior Year

- 4 courses at BHS (includes 0 Period)
- 2 courses at HCCC per semester

Senior Year

- 1 course at BHS (0 period)
- 3 courses at HCCC per semester

Projected courses are subject to change based on course offerings and staff availability

Benefits of The Early College Academy

- Classes are taught by BHS teachers who serve as HCCC adjunct instructors
- Classes count toward both high school graduation and college credit (dual enrollment)
